Forest area is constantly increasing, and our forests continue to grow in volume and size.

> FROM 1985. THE FOREST AREA HAS INCREASED BY 1.7 MILLION HECTARES IN ITALY



In 2022, 24% of total increment (1m³/ha) (71% Trentino Alto Adige, Toscana, Lombardia, Emilia-Romagna, Calabria e Piemonte)

Holistic Perspective

Sharing Business Model

 Enhances the value of forests by creating a short, virtuous supply chain

Promotes an innovative forestry culture

How does it work?





Forest Owner Registration

- · Free access to the Forest Sharing platform
- Registration is non-binding





Connecting Forest Areas

- The platform aggregates forest properties
- Identifies clusters of neighboring landowners



Shared Forest Management Plan

- Covers properties of multiple users
- Designed to enhance forest functions
- Tailored to the specific characteristics of each area



- Forest Sharing handles the management plan, technical procedures, and coordination of all stakeholders
- Retains a percentage only after revenues are generated

Benefits and Funding

- Owners receive both economic and environmental benefits, depending on the management approach
- Resources to implement plans come from:
 - Integrated management (reinvesting part of the forest revenues)
 - Public or private funding









Involvement of Multiple Actors

Collaboration between institutions, communities, and private stakeholders.

A Broad Forest Supply Chain

Not limited to wood production — includes:
